
Removing the Lock Catch From a 42-U Rack Cabinet



Notes, Notices, and Cautions



NOTICE: A NOTICE indicates either potential damage to hardware or loss of data and tells you how to avoid the problem.

CAUTION: A CAUTION indicates a potential for property damage, personal injury, or death.

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When installing a new front door on a 42-U rack cabinet that has a lock catch on both horizontal frame members, you must remove the lock catch on the hinge side of the rack cabinet before installing the new door.

NOTICE: An installed lock catch on the hinge-side of the rack will damage the new door if you do not remove the latch before installing the door.


To remove the lock catch from the hinge side of the rack cabinet, perform the following steps.



CAUTION: See the *Rack Installation Guide* that came with your rack for complete safety instructions before beginning this procedure.

- 1 Use a #1 Phillips screwdriver to remove the two #1 Phillips screws that hold the lock catch to the middle horizontal frame member.
 - **NOTE:** A Torx screw is on the horizontal frame member under the lock catch. Do not remove this Torx screw.
- **2** Remove the lock catch (see Figure 1-1).

3 On the horizontal frame member that held the lock catch, reinstall the two #1 Phillips screws to maintain structural integrity.
